



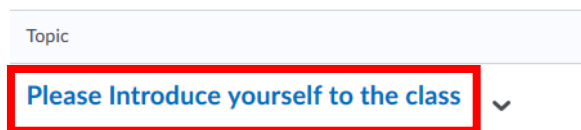
Evaluating Student Work from Within a Discussion Thread

This tutorial shows the instructor how to evaluate a student's work in the discussion tool without leaving the threaded discussion.

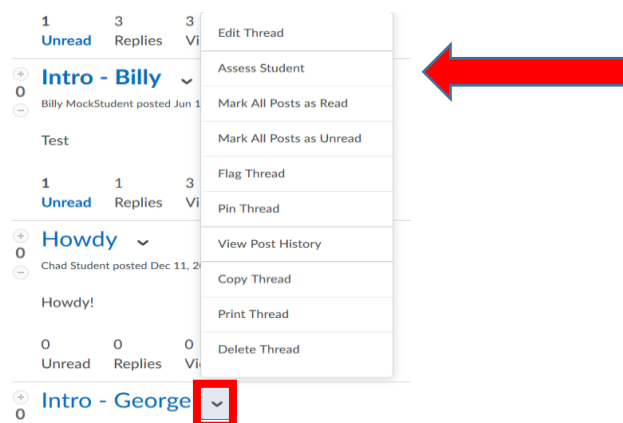
Note: You must have a grade item for the discussion topic.

In this example, we will use a topic called "Please Introduce yourself to the class".

- From the Discussions tool, click the down arrow beside the topic you wish to assess.
- Click the link to the discussion:



- To add a score for a response to a particular student, you need to click on the particular response of the student and select "Assess Student".





- If you have a rubric attached to the discussion topic, click the boxes in the rubric that apply to the student
- You also have the option to add feedback for the particular criteria by clicking the “Add Feedback” link under each criterion:

Criteria	Level 4 4 points	Level 3 3 points	Level 2 2 points	Level 1 1 point

- You also need enter a score for each post the student created:

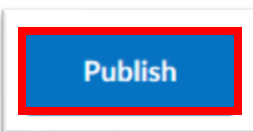
